100 Years of the National Park Service

The 99th anniversary of the National Park Service was the 25th of August. You can help to create a strong future for the NPS by first learning about its storied history. When President Woodrow Wilson signed the National Park Service Organic Act into law in 1916, the National Park Service was only overseeing 45 sites. Legislation applied for the NPS to "conserve the scenery and the natural and historic objects and the wildlife therein and to provide for the enjoyment of the same in such manner and by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations."


In recent years, the NPS has grown to oversee over 400 sites, and more than 45 million acres, in all 50 states. As the NPS grew, so did its overall mission; the National Park Service is now a world leader in environmental health, parks and preservation, cultural preservation, and pioneers in protecting America's Open Spaces.

As the NPS nears the centennial, the organization has embraced new technologies and trends in order to appeal to new generations.
